

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1. The Global Fact-Checking Network (hereinafter referred to as the "Network") is a voluntary, corporate, membership-based Network of persons who share the goals and principles of the Network's activities, established to represent and protect common interests and to achieve the socially beneficial purposes specified in this Charter.

1.2. For the purposes of this Charter, the term "fact-checking" shall mean the verification of the reliability of information. The term "fact-checker" shall mean a specialist in the field of information verification.

1.3. The members of the Network shall retain their legal and economic independence. The Network is not a superior organization in relation to its members. The Network shall possess only those powers and perform only those functions that have been voluntarily delegated to it by its members. The Network is an independent legal entity.

1.4. The organizational and legal form of the Network shall be that of an association. The legal status of the Network shall be determined by the Civil Code of the Russian Federation, the Federal Law "On Non-Profit Organizations," other regulatory legal acts of the Russian Federation, this Charter, as well as generally recognized international principles, norms, and standards.

1.5. The Network is established without any limitation on its term of activity.

1.6. The Network shall possess separate property, maintain an independent balance sheet, and/or cost estimate.

1.7. The Network may act as a plaintiff or defendant in courts of general jurisdiction, arbitration courts, and tribunals, acquire and exercise property and non-property rights in its own name in accordance with the objectives of the Network's activities as set forth in this Charter, and bear the obligations related to such activities.

1.8. The Network shall have the right, in accordance with the established procedure, to open bank accounts in the territory of the Russian Federation and abroad, except in cases provided for by federal law.

1.9. The Network shall have a seal bearing its full name in Russian. The Network may have stamps and letterheads with its name. The Network may have symbols, emblems, coats of arms, other heraldic signs, flags, and anthems, the description of which shall be included in the Charter. At the time of its establishment, the Network does not have any symbols.

1.10. The Network may establish branches and open representative offices in the territory of the Russian Federation in accordance with the legislation of the Russian Federation.

1.11. The Network shall not be liable for the obligations of its members, except in cases provided for by the legislation of the Russian Federation. The members of the Network shall not bear subsidiary liability for the obligations of the Network.

1.12. The provisions of this Charter shall be binding on all bodies and members of the Network.

1.13. The Network may engage in entrepreneurial and other income-generating activities insofar as such activities serve the achievement of the purposes for which it was established and comply with the objectives set forth in this Charter, provided that such activities meet the requirements of applicable law.

The Network shall maintain records of income and expenses related to its income-generating activities.

1.14. In the interests of achieving its objectives, the Network may establish other non-profit organizations and join associations and unions.

1.15. The Network shall acquire the rights of a legal entity from the moment of its state registration.

The full name of the Network in Russian: Международная ассоциация по фактчекингу.

The abbreviated name of the Network in Russian: Международная ассоциация по фактчекингу.

The full name of the Network in English: GLOBAL FACT-CHECKING NETWORK. The abbreviated name of the Network in English: GFCN.

1.16. The location of the Network: Russian Federation, Moscow.

The address of the Network shall be specified in the Unified State Register of Legal Entities.

2. OBJECTIVES, SCOPE, AND TYPES OF ACTIVITIES OF THE NETWORK

2.1. The objectives of the Network are to unite its members for the representation and protection of common, including professional, interests, as well as to carry out and coordinate the activities of its members aimed at:

- Creating and developing opportunities for communication, knowledge sharing, and exchange of experience among members of the Network;
- Promoting the improvement of the quality and objectivity of information at the national and international levels;
- Counteracting the spread of false information and disinformation;
- Raising public awareness about reliable data and the risks associated with the spread of false information;
- Developing the professional skills of the global community of fact-checkers;
- Fostering relationships among members of the Network and promoting international cooperation in the field of fact-checking;
- Developing methodologies and unified standards for fact-checking;
- Training and developing the competencies of fact-checkers worldwide, regardless of their institutionalization;
- Facilitating the creation of conditions to maximize the effectiveness of fact-checkers.

2.2. The scope of the Network's activities is the achievement of its statutory objectives.

2.3. To achieve the objectives set forth in Clause 2.1 of this Charter, the Network shall carry out the following activities:

- Organizing and conducting professional events, including seminars, forums, conferences, and other events aimed at achieving the Network's objectives, with the participation of leading

specialists in the field of fact-checking. Participation in similar events organized by state bodies, public associations, and other organizations.

- Representing and protecting the common (as well as professional) interests of the Network's members, and coordinating their activities to achieve the Network's statutory objectives;
- Attracting the attention of state, public, commercial, and other Russian and foreign organizations, as well as interstate organizations, to the activities of the Network;
- Providing expert, advisory, and informational support to Russian, foreign, and international organizations on topics related to the Network's activities;
- Developing and promoting the implementation of new, including innovative, methods and technologies for verifying data reliability;
- Acting as a mediator to facilitate collegial decisions in cases of discrepancies in assessments among fact-checkers who are members of the Network;
- Conducting events aimed at raising funds for the implementation of the Network's projects and programs;
- Creating, maintaining, disseminating, and ensuring the use of databases and information resources on topics related to the Network's activities, in accordance with the law;
- Organizing professional development courses, training sessions, and masterclasses on topics related to the Network's activities;
- Participating, in accordance with the established procedure, in programs and events organized by state bodies, local self-government bodies, public and other organizations in the development and application of regulatory legal acts related to the Network's field of activity;
- Cooperating with state authorities of the Russian Federation, state authorities of the constituent entities of the Russian Federation, local self-government bodies, public Networks, organizations, and institutions on issues aligned with the Network's objectives;
- Preparing proposals on the formation and implementation of state policy and policies pursued by local self-government bodies on issues aligned with the Network's objectives, and submitting such proposals for consideration to the relevant state authorities and local self-government bodies in the Russian Federation;
- Participating in the preparation of draft federal laws and other regulatory legal acts of the Russian Federation, laws and other regulatory legal acts of the constituent entities of the Russian Federation, and municipal legal acts on issues aligned with the Network's objectives, in accordance with the procedure established by the relevant legislation and municipal legal acts;
- Participating in the preparation of international regulatory legal acts and "soft law" norms;
- Challenging, in its own name and in accordance with the procedure established by the legislation of the Russian Federation, any acts, decisions, and/or actions (or inaction) of state authorities of the Russian Federation, state authorities of the constituent entities of the Russian Federation, and local self-government bodies that violate the rights and legitimate interests of the Network or its members, or pose a threat of such violation;
- Cooperating with Russian and foreign partners on issues aligned with the Network's objectives;
- Facilitating the systematization, preparation, and publication, and, where necessary, financing and dissemination of informational and reference materials, educational literature, including through online resources, on topics aligned with the Network's statutory objectives;
- Establishing, approving, and awarding various prizes, awards, grants, honorary titles, etc., for merits in the field of the Network's activities, as well as establishing its own media outlets;
- Engaging in publishing and printing activities, producing and disseminating informational and other materials, and creating its own television and radio programs to achieve the Network's statutory objectives, in accordance with the established procedure;

- Facilitating the creation and support of electronic information resources on the Internet that cover the Network's activities.

2.4. The Network may engage in income-generating activities only insofar as such activities serve the achievement of the purposes for which the Network was established. Such activities may include profit-generating production of goods and services aligned with the Network's objectives, as well as the acquisition and sale of securities, property and non-property rights, participation in business entities, including publishing activities, organizing events (seminars, forums, conferences) within the framework of the Network's statutory objectives, and providing informational and consulting services, in accordance with the Network's goals and activities.

2.5. The Network may engage in certain types of activities, the list of which is determined by law, only on the basis of a special permit (license) in accordance with the legislation of the Russian Federation.

2.6. To carry out educational activities, the Network shall establish a specialized structural educational unit within its structure. The activities of such a unit shall be governed by regulations developed and approved by the Network.

2.7. The participation of the Network's members in its activities shall be carried out within the powers conferred upon them by the legislation of the Russian Federation.

3. GOVERNING BODIES OF THE NETWORK

3.1. The Network shall have the following governing bodies:

- The supreme governing body of the Network: The General Meeting of the Network's members (hereinafter referred to as "The General Meeting");
- The permanent collegial executive body of the Network: The Network Council (hereinafter referred to as the "The Council");
- The sole executive body of the Network: the President.

4. GENERAL MEETING

4.1. The supreme governing body of the Network's is the General Meeting.

4.2. The General Meeting shall be convened as needed but no less than once a year.

4.3. An extraordinary General Meeting may be convened:

- By decision of the Council or the President;
- Upon a written request from at least one-third of the Network's members.

An extraordinary General Meeting shall be convened in the same manner as an ordinary meeting and must be held within one month from the date the President officially receives the request.

4.4. The exclusive competence of the General Meeting includes:

4.4.1. Determining the Network's priority activities and the principles of asset formation and use;

4.4.2. Approving and amending the Network's Charter;

- 4.4.3. Establishing the procedure for admitting and expelling members, unless such procedure is defined by law;
- 4.4.4. Deciding on the amount and method of membership fees, as well as additional property contributions by members;
- 4.4.5. Electing and dismissing members of the Council and the President;
- 4.4.6. Approving annual reports and financial (accounting) statements;
- 4.4.7. Deciding on the establishment of or participation in other legal entities, branches, or representative offices;
- 4.4.8. Deciding on reorganization, liquidation, appointment of a liquidation committee, and approval of the liquidation balance;
- 4.4.9. Determining membership admission and expulsion procedures, unless stipulated by Russian law;
- 4.4.10. Appointing an audit firm or individual auditor;
- 4.4.11. Reviewing and approving reports of the Network's Council.

4.5. The General Meeting may address any other matters related to the Network's activities.

4.6. Matters within the exclusive competence of the General Meeting cannot be delegated to other bodies of the Network.

4.7. Members shall be notified of a General Meeting via mail, fax, telegram, phone message, or email. The Network may additionally inform members through mass media (newspapers, TV, radio, or the Internet).

4.8. The General Meeting may be held via video conference. Participation in this format must be recorded in the minutes. Decisions may also be made via absentee voting (polling), except on matters of exclusive competence. Voting may occur via mail, telegraph, fax, email, or other means ensuring authenticity and documentation.

4.9. Notices of a General Meeting must be sent at least 15 days in advance and include:

- Date, time, and venue;
- Agenda items;
- Procedure for accessing meeting materials.

4.10. A quorum requires attendance (or representation) by over half of the Network's members.

4.11. Each member has one vote.

4.12. Decisions are adopted by a simple majority of attending members. Matters of exclusive competence require a two-thirds majority.

4.13. Minutes must be drafted within five business days and signed by the chairperson and secretary, who are responsible for accuracy.

5. COUNCIL

5.1. The Council is the permanent collegial executive body managing the Association between General Meetings. It meets as needed but at least twice a year.

5.2. Elected by the General Meeting for five-year terms, the Council must have at least two members.

5.3. Members may be re-elected. Early termination of powers may be proposed to the General Meeting.

5.4. The Council is accountable to the General Meeting.

5.5. It may address any matters except those reserved for the General Meeting.

5.6. The Council's duties include:

5.6.1. Drafting long-term/annual plans and programs for the General Meeting;

5.6.2. Preliminary review of agenda items;

5.6.3. Overseeing implementation of General Meeting decisions;

5.6.4. Convening General Meetings;

5.6.5. Managing the Network's assets;

5.6.6. Approving/changing the financial plan;

5.6.7. Reviewing membership admissions/terminations;

5.6.8. Approving the President's employment contract terms.

5.7. A quorum requires over half of Council members. Decisions are made by simple majority vote.

5.8. If the Council consists of 2 members, a meeting of the Council shall be legally competent if all its members are present at the said meeting.

If the Council consists of 2 members, the decisions of the Council shall be adopted by all its members unanimously.

5.9. Decisions at the meetings of the Board shall be formalized by the Minutes, which shall be drawn up not later than 3 working days after the meeting of the Board. Copies of the Minutes shall be signed by the Chairman and the Secretary of the meeting.

6. PRESIDENT

6.1. The President is the sole executive body, managing day-to-day operations.

6.2. Elected by the General Meeting for five-year terms, the President may be re-elected.

6.3. The President of the Network shall act on behalf of the Network without power of attorney, represent its interests in relations with state and local authorities, legal entities and citizens, other persons both in the Russian Federation and abroad, make transactions, conclude agreements, issue powers of attorney, issue orders, perform other legally significant and actual actions on behalf of the Network, except for those within the competence of the General Meeting and the Council, including:

6.3.1. Implementing decisions of the General Meeting and Council;

6.3.2. Preparing materials for meetings;

6.3.3. Overseeing branches/representative offices;

- 6.3.4. Approving staff structure;
- 6.3.5. Organizing events;
- 6.3.6. Managing bank accounts (with first-signatory rights);
- 6.3.7. Issuing orders/binding instructions;
- 6.3.8. Maintaining the membership register;
- 6.3.9. Performing other non-exclusive functions.

6.4. The President's rights/obligations are defined by Russian law, this Charter, and their employment contract.

7. MEMBERSHIP IN THE NETWORK, PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL, RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE NETWORK MEMBERS

7.1. Membership in the Network is voluntary.

7.2. Members of the Network may be fully capable citizens of the Russian Federation, legal entities, as well as foreign citizens and stateless persons legally staying in the Russian Federation (except for cases established by international treaties of the Russian Federation or federal laws) and complying with the provisions of this Charter, internal documents of the Network.

7.3. Members of the Network shall retain their independence, have equal rights and bear equal responsibilities.

7.4. The procedure for admission to and expulsion from the Network shall be determined by the General Meeting of Network members. Admission of new members of the Network is carried out by the Council on the basis of a personal application of a natural person, or a decision of an authorized body and an application of a legal entity. Documents on becoming a member of the Network shall be submitted to the President of the Network. The application shall be considered at the nearest meeting of the Network Council from the day of submission of documents.

7.5. A candidate shall be deemed accepted as a member of the Network after the Network Council has made a decision. The Council of the Network or the President of the Network in order to make a decision by the Council of the Network has the right to require the candidate to provide recommendations from three of the current members of the Network. Absence of such recommendations may be the reason for refusal to admit a new member to the Network.

7.6. The rights of a member of the Network may not be transferred to third parties.

7.7. A member of the Network has the right to withdraw from the Network at his/her own discretion at any time. The withdrawal of a member from the Network shall be accomplished by submitting a written notice to the President of the Network. No later than three months after the filing of such notice, the Network shall:

7.8. Determine the terms for returning to the member the property loaned by the member to the Network;

7.9. Determine the amount and terms of return of the property acquired by the member at the expense of the Network's funds or used by the member;

7.10. To make financial and credit settlements with the retiring member under the contracts concluded with the Network;

7.11. To determine the procedure for fulfillment by the member of the obligations assumed earlier in relation to other members of the Network and to the Network.

7.12. Periodic contributions received from members of the Network shall not be refunded.

7.13. Members of the Network may be excluded from the Network in cases of:

7.14. Actions (or inaction) damaging the Network's reputation, hindering its operations, or causing losses (as confirmed by a court ruling);

7.15. Failure to pay within 5 (five) years the membership fee or other contribution provided for mandatory payment;

7.16. Failure to fulfill decisions made by the Network's governing bodies within their competence established by this Charter.

7.17. The decision on exclusion from the Network shall be made in writing, indicating the reasons for exclusion.

8. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF NETWORK MEMBERS

8.1 Members of the Network have the right:

8.1.1. to participate in the management of affairs in accordance with the procedure established by the Network's Charter;

8.1.2. receive information about the Network's activities and familiarize themselves with its accounting and other documentation (by sending requests to the President of the Network; the President of the Network shall consider such requests within 30 days and inform the members of the Network on the issues raised in them or provide an opportunity to familiarize themselves with the accounting and other documentation of the Network at its address (location);

8.1.3. appeal against decisions of the Network's bodies entailing civil legal consequences in the cases and in the manner prescribed by law;

8.1.4. to demand, acting on behalf of the Network (Article 182.1 of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation), compensation for losses caused to the Network (Article 53.1 of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation);

8.1.5. to challenge, acting on behalf of the Network (Article 182, paragraph 1 of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation), the transactions made by the Network on the grounds provided for by Article 174 of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation or the laws on corporations of certain organizational and legal forms, and to demand the application of the consequences of their invalidity, as well as the application of the consequences of invalidity of void transactions of the Network;

8.1.6. on an equal basis with other members of the Network to use its services free of charge, unless otherwise provided by law;

8.1.7. request information from the Network's management bodies on the status of fulfillment of the decisions of the General Meeting and its proposals;

- 8.1.8. make proposals to the agenda of General Meetings;
- 8.1.9. to receive consultative, methodical, legal and other assistance from the Network;
- 8.1.10. transfer property into the ownership of the Network;
- 8.1.11. to submit proposals for consideration of the Network's bodies on all issues that are the subject of the Network's activities, participate in their discussion and decision-making;
- 8.1.12. to finance projects and programs of the Network;
- 8.1.13. use business and commercial information available in the Network to the full extent;
- 8.1.14. to withdraw from the Network at his/her own discretion at any time.

8.2 The rights of a member of the Network may not be transferred to third parties.

8.3 Members of the Network are obliged to:

- 8.3.1. to participate in the formation of the Network's property in the required amount in the manner, method and within the timeframe stipulated by the Civil Code of the Russian Federation, other law or the founding document of the Network;
- 8.3.2. not to disclose confidential information about the Network's activities;
- 8.3.3. to participate in making decisions without which the Network cannot continue its activities in accordance with the law, if his/her participation is necessary for making such decisions;
- 8.3.4. not to perform actions knowingly aimed at causing harm to the Network;
- 8.3.5. not to commit actions (inaction) that significantly hinder or make it impossible to achieve the goals for which the Network was established;
- 8.3.6. to pay membership fees stipulated by the Charter and by decision of the General Meeting to make additional property contributions to the Network's property;
- 8.3.7. comply with the current legislation of the Russian Federation, the Charter of the Network, and other acts adopted by the management bodies of the Network within the scope of their authority;
- 8.3.8. make efforts to achieve the statutory goals of the Network;
- 8.3.9. to take into account public opinion and social consequences of his/her activity when performing any actions;
- 8.3.10. to respect the interests of other members, to strictly comply with the terms of agreements, contracts and agreements, to compensate for the damage caused;
- 8.3.11. provide information necessary to resolve issues related to the Network's activities;
- 8.3.12. Members of the Network may also have other rights and bear other responsibilities in accordance with the legislation of the Russian Federation.

8.4. Damage caused to the Network through the fault of its members shall be compensated by them in full by decision of the General Meeting.

8.5. A member of the Network, who systematically fails to fulfill or improperly fulfills his/her duties or violates his/her obligations to the Network, as well as hinders the normal work of the Network by his/her actions or inaction, may be excluded from the Network by the decision of the Council.

9. OBSERVERS IN THE NETWORK. ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE, RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF OBSERVERS

9.1. Observer status in the Network can be assigned to organizations and (or) individuals who are not members of the Network, but are interested in its activities and support its goals and objectives.

9.2. The decision to grant the status of an Observer shall be made at the General Meeting of Network members by a simple majority of votes.

9.3. Organizations and (or) individuals applying for the status of an Observer shall submit a corresponding application to the Network Council, providing information about their activities and motivation to participate in the Network as an Observer.

The Network Council shall submit the applications for admission of candidates to the Network's Observers for consideration by the General Meeting.

9.4. Observers shall have the right to participate in the meetings of the General Meeting of the Network without the right to vote.

9.5. Observers may make recommendations on issues discussed at the meetings, but such proposals are not subject to mandatory consideration and voting.

9.6. Observers shall have access to materials and documents of the Network, except for those restricted for internal use of the Network members.

9.7. Observers may participate in working groups and committees of the Network as consultants or experts, if provided for by the relevant provisions on working groups and committees.

9.8. Observers shall be obliged to observe the Charter of the Network and support its goals and objectives in their activities.

9.9. The status of an Observer may be terminated by decision of the General Meeting of Network members in case of violation by the Observer of the provisions of the Charter or actions contrary to the goals and objectives of the Network.

9.10. An Observer may voluntarily give up his/her status by notifying the Network Council in writing.

9.11. In case of termination of the Observer status, the organization or individual shall cease to use all privileges associated with this status and return all m

10. PROPERTY, FINANCIAL AND BUSINESS OPERATIONS OF THE NETWORK

10.1. In accordance with the legislation of the Russian Federation, the Network shall have the legal capacity to own buildings, structures, housing stock, equipment, inventory, funds in rubles and foreign currency, securities, and other property essential for fulfilling its statutory objectives as defined by this Charter.

10.2. The Network may conduct any transactions regarding its property, provided such transactions do not violate the laws of the Russian Federation or the provisions of this Charter.

10.3. All property transferred to the Network shall become the Network's property.

10.4. The sources of the Network's property formation, in monetary and other forms, shall include:

- recurring contributions (with a minimum frequency of once every five years) and one-time payments from Network members;
- voluntary property contributions and donations;
- revenue generated from the sale of goods, works, and services;
- investment income, including dividends, interest, and other yields from shares, bonds, securities, and deposits;
- income derived from the Network's property assets;
- other lawful receipts not prohibited by applicable legislation.

10.5. The Network shall be the owner of its property. The Network shall be liable for its obligations with all of its property. The Network shall not be liable for the obligations of its members unless otherwise provided by law. Members of the Network shall not be liable for its obligations. This Charter does not provide for subsidiary liability of the Network members.

10.6. The Network shall maintain accounting records and submit statistical reports in compliance with applicable laws and regulations of the Russian Federation.

10.7. The fiscal year shall run from January 1 through December 31 of each calendar year.

10.8. The Network shall have the right to engage a specialized audit firm or an independent auditor to review and verify its annual financial statements (external audit). The external auditor must be approved by resolution of the General Meeting.

10.9. The Network shall be responsible for the preservation of management, financial, economic, and personnel documents, as well as other documents in accordance with established procedures, and shall ensure the transfer of documents of scientific and historical importance to the Central Archives for state storage.

11. REGULATIONS ON AMENDMENTS TO THE NETWORK'S STATUTORY DOCUMENTS

11.1. Amendments to the Network's Statutes shall be approved by resolution of the General Meeting in compliance with the provisions of these Statutes and shall be registered according to the procedures prescribed by applicable legislation of the Russian Federation.

11.2. Amendments to the Network's constituent documents shall take effect upon their state registration.

12. REORGANIZATION AND LIQUIDATION OF THE NETWORK

12.1. Reorganization of the Network shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation of the Russian Federation. Such reorganization may take the form of merger, consolidation, division, spin-off, or transformation. Pursuant to a decision by its members, the Network may be converted into a public organization, an autonomous non-profit organization, or a foundation.

12.2. The reorganization of the Network shall be effected by resolution of the General Meeting in compliance with the provisions of this Charter.

12.3. Upon reorganization, all assets, liabilities, property rights, and non-property rights of the Network shall be transferred to its legal successor(s) as prescribed by the civil legislation of the Russian Federation.

12.4. Following the General Meeting's resolution regarding the Network's reorganization, the Network's authorized governing body shall provide written notification to all creditors.

12.5. The Network may be liquidated either by General Meeting resolution pursuant to this Charter or by court order.

12.6. The liquidation of the Network shall result in its termination without any transfer of rights or obligations through legal succession to third parties.

12.7. Upon its appointment, the liquidation commission shall assume full authority to manage the affairs of the Network.

12.8. The liquidation commission shall publish a notice of the Network's liquidation in official press outlets, specifying the claims submission procedure and deadline for creditors.

12.9. After the creditors' claims period concludes, the liquidation commission shall prepare an interim liquidation balance sheet for approval by either the General Meeting or the governing body that ordered the Network's liquidation.

12.10. After satisfying all creditor obligations, the liquidation commission shall prepare a definitive liquidation balance sheet for approval by either the General Meeting or the competent governing body that initiated the liquidation process.

12.11. Alternative version as single paragraph:

Residual assets following creditor satisfaction shall be devoted to the Network's statutory objectives and/or charitable purposes, with any property unsuitable for such applications reverting to state ownership.

12.12. Throughout reorganization or liquidation proceedings, the Network must maintain complete personnel records and ensure their preservation and subsequent transfer to designated state archives in compliance with archival regulations.

The Main Directorate of the Ministry of Justice of the Russian Federation (Moscow) officially registered the Global Fact-Checking Network on 13 January 2025 (Registry No. 7714065623).

The non-profit organization's state registration details were entered into the Unified State Register of Legal Entities (EGRUL) on January 14, 2025, under Primary State Registration Number 1257700007146.
